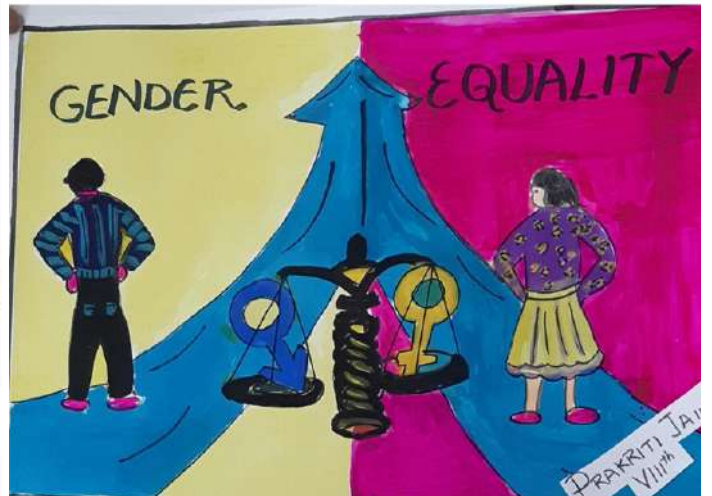

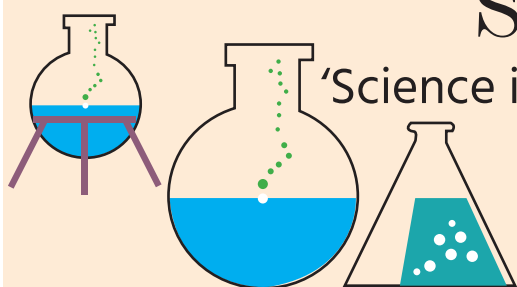

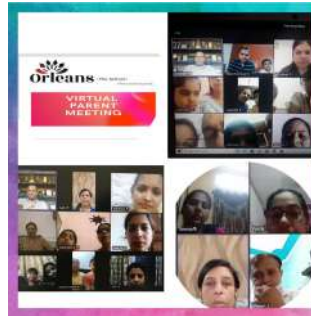

Facts on Independence Day

- 1.) There was no national anthem sung on our first independence day on 15th August 1947. National Anthem was written by Rabindranath Tagore.
"Jana Gana Mana" was adopted as the country's National Anthem by the Constituent Assembly of India on January 24, 1950.
- 2.) Apart from India, other countries like Korea, Bahrain and Republic of Congo got Independence on the same day i.e. 15th August.
- 3.) Although India became independent on July 18, 1947, Lord Mountbatten was given the mandate by the British Parliament to transfer power to India in June 1948.
- 4.) Cyril John Radcliffe was given the task of drawing the borders of the Independent India. Despite the fact that he had never come to India, he was given this task of division of the country.
- 5.) The name Bharata or Bharata Varsha is said to be derived from the name of either Dushyanta's son Bharata or Rishabha's son Bharata. That is why our country is called Bharat in Hindi.
- 6.) The National flag was hoisted at the Parsee Bagan Square in Calcutta on August 7, 1906. The flag had three horizontal strips of red, yellow and green colour. The red strip at the top consisted of 8 white lotuses imprinted on the flag in a line. On a yellow strip, Vande Mataram was written in Hindi. There was a white sun on the left and a white crescent and star on the right imprinted on the green strip.

Money Management to achieve Financial Freedom....

Money is important in life and it gives you the freedom to live your life on your terms. We all love freedom. However, when we talk about Financial Freedom, it looks a little difficult.

Because to earn money, we need to work hard every day, doing overtime, doing stretch, always search for additional source of income etc...

However, if we learn, how to manage our money, we can bridge the gap and attain financial freedom. Followings are the 13 SUTRA, which we must apply to manage our money :

1. Start Savings and Investments as soon as possible in your life.
2. Do not spend first and then save rest from monthly pay out. Save First, Spend Rest.
3. The greatest discipline in personal finance is living below your means.
4. Don't think how it would have been if you've started 10 years ago. Start today and visualise how you would feel 10 years from now.
5. Early financial independence and early retirement are completely different. The former is a blessing, and the latter is a curse.
6. The biggest asset one can have is zero debt.
7. Paying minimum balance regularly on credit card is the maximum sign that you're getting into debt trap.
8. The biggest asset one can have is zero debt.
9. Losing opportunities is far better than losing money. Don't invest in fads.
10. Bonds are for storing wealth and equities are for creation of wealth.
11. We'll stop looking for quick money the moment we consider stocks as businesses and realise that our wealth grows in line with business growth.

12. There are periods of high returns, low returns, no returns, and negative returns. We need to go through all these to get long term returns.

13. Trying to get rich fast is a fool proof way to lose what we have.

Let me share few financial formulas to help to calculate our future investment goals :

1. **100 Minus your age Rule:**

This rule is used for asset allocation. Subtract your age from 100 to find out, how much you should invest in Equities and Debt:

Age 30: Equity 70%, Debt 30%

Age 60: Equity 40%, Debt 60%

2. **40% EMI Rule:**

Never go beyond 40% of your income into EMIs.

Say, if you earn 50,000 per month, you should not have EMIs more than 20,000.

3. **Rule of 114:** To triple your money

Divide 114 by the Return you are getting on your investment to get the years required to triple your money:

For example: If you want to know how long it will take to triple your money at 12% yearly return, divide 114 by 12 and get 9.5 years.

At 6% yearly return, it will take 19 years.

4. **Rule of 72 :** To Double your money

Divide 72 by the Return you are getting on your investment to get the years required to double your money :

For example: If you want to know how long it will take to double your money at 12% yearly return, divide 72 by 12 and get 6 years.

At 6% yearly return, it will take 12 years.
